

## **Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI) and BWI Amtrak Station:**

BWI is the closest, most convenient airport to Annapolis. An Amtrak train station is also located near the airport.

### **BY CAR:**

Take **Interstate 97 South** for 15 minutes and get off on **Rowe Blvd., Exit 24**.

Take **Rowe Blvd.** 1.6 miles to where it dead-ends at **College Ave.** - make a **left turn**. The College is located on the **left** between **St. Johns St.** and **King George St.**

### **BY SHUTTLE:**

There are two private shuttle services that run between BWI and Annapolis.

#### **1. The Airport Shuttle 1-800-776-0323 [www.theairportshuttle.com](http://www.theairportshuttle.com)**

The Airport Shuttle provides door-to-door service at any hour. **The cost is \$39.00 for one passenger from the airport to Annapolis.** You must reserve 48 hours in advance with a major credit card, but actual payment can be made with card or cash. You will be charged for the trip unless you cancel at least two hours before pick up. **Each additional passenger costs \$7.00 dollars**

#### **2. BWI Super Shuttle 1-800-258-3826 [www.supershuttle.com](http://www.supershuttle.com)**

Super Shuttle provides door-to-door service at any hour. **The cost is \$35.00 dollars for one passenger from BWI to Annapolis.** You do not need to make a reservation if you are traveling from the airport to Annapolis but if you are traveling from Annapolis to BWI you must make a reservation at least 48 hours in advance. A Super Shuttle counter is located at BWI and a shuttle leaves the airport at every odd hour until 12:00 midnight. **Each additional passenger costs \$12.00.**

### **BY CAB:**

To/From Annapolis, the trip costs at least \$60 dollars. Cab companies listed on the internet

## **Dulles International Airport**

### **BY CAR:**

Take **Dulles Access Rd** to the exit toward **I-495 S**. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for **Interstate 495 S/Richmond** and merge onto **I-495 S** for 12 miles. Merge onto **I-495 E/I-95 N** and continue for 24 miles. Take exit **19A** to merge onto **US-50 E** and continue for 18 miles. Take **exit 24, Rowe Blvd.** Take **Rowe Blvd.** 1.6 miles to where it dead-ends at **College Ave.** - make a **left turn**. The College is located on the **left** between **St. Johns St** and **King George St.**

**BY METRO:**

Metrorail is the region's rapid-transit system, providing access to Downtown Washington, DC and other destinations. A rail line to Dulles Airport (to be called the Silver Line) is under construction. At present, the nearest Metrorail station is the West Falls Church Station on the Orange Line. Direct transportation to this station is available from the Washington Flyer Coach Service. Each coach is handicapped accessible. Buses depart approximately every 30 minutes and boarding announcements are made inside the airport. **BY CAB:**

To/From Annapolis, the trip costs at least \$100.00. Cab companies listed on the internet.

## ***Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport***

**BY CAR:**

Get on **I-395** from S Smith Blvd and George Washington Memorial Pkwy for 1.6 miles. Keep left to continue on **I-695** for 1.9 miles. Take the exit onto **District of Columbia Hwy 295** for 4.8 miles then take the **U.S. 50 E/U.S. 50 W** exit toward Annapolis. Continue onto **US-301 N/US-50 E** for 22 miles. Take **Rowe Blvd.** 1.6 miles to where it dead-ends at **College Ave.** - make a **left turn**. The College is located on the **left** between **St. Johns St** and **King George St.**

**BY SHUTTLE:**

Super Shuttle provides door to door service at any hour. The cost is **\$49.00 dollars for one passenger** from the airport to Annapolis. **Each additional passenger costs \$10.00.** A Super Shuttle counter is located at National Airport a shuttle leaves the airport at every odd hour until 12:00 midnight. After hours, call 1-800-258-3826 and press 1 for dispatch or 2 for reservations.

**Getting TO the Metrorail station FROM the Terminals:**

- **Terminal B and C:** Use either of two enclosed pedestrian bridges on the concourse level which connect directly to the station.

- **Terminal A:** Exit the terminal to the street side curb, and board any “Airport Shuttle” bus. At the stops for Terminal B/C or Parking Garages B and C you may access an enclosed bridge which connects to the Metrorail station.

**From this station, you can either get on the Blue line or the Yellow line.** Go on the Blue line towards Largo or the Yellow line towards Fort Totten. You will need to transfer to the Orange line at some point, the easiest location to make this transfer is L’Enfant Plaza, although there should be announcements at each stop that state what lines you can transfer to. You will want to get on the Orange line towards New Carrollton. **\*\*see New Carrollton section below\*\***

**BY CAB:**

To/From Annapolis, the trip costs at least \$75.00. Cab companies listed on the internet.

**New Carrollton Metro/Train Station:**

New Carrollton has an Amtrak station and is a Metro stop on the Orange Line that goes directly to stops on the Washington, DC mall and can connect you to other Metro lines in Maryland, DC, and Virginia. It is the closest Metro Station to Annapolis. It may be easiest to take the Metro from Dulles or Ronald Reagan Airports to the New Carrollton stop. It is the last stop on the Orange Line.

**BY CAR:**

Take **50 East** for 20-25 minutes and get off on **Rowe Blvd, Exit 24**.

Take **Rowe Blvd** 1.6 miles to where it dead-ends at **College Ave** - make a **left turn**. The College is located on the **left** between **St. Johns St.** and **King George St.**

**BY BUS:**

There is a Monday through Friday commuter bus service to New Carrollton and DC called **Dillon’s**. Because it is a commuter service, **Dillon’s does not run on Saturday or Sunday**. The service runs from 5-9 AM and then again from around 3-7 PM. The #950 makes 11 stops and takes you to the New Carrollton Metro, where you can connect to the DC metro and Amtrak. The #922 makes 17 stops, including stops at Capitol Hill, Pennsylvania Ave., and Union Station. **The closest bus stop to St. Johns is the West Street/ Calvert Street stop**, about a 5 minute walk from campus up West Street. **The #921 to New Carrollton is \$4.25 exact change. The #922 to DC is \$4.25 exact change.** You can find a complete schedule of Dillon’s Bus Service at Switchboard, or online at:
