## Important Summer Activities for Current Students

**Freshmen** will undoubtedly be relaxing from an intense first year at St. John's, but it's never too early to think about what you want to do after graduation. This is a good summer to try to narrow your career interests and think about applying for an Ariel internship to test-drive an unfamiliar job or to discover whether the field you want to pursue after St. John's will require coursework that isn't offered here. If that is the case, research schools both overseas and in the US so that you will have the foundation for a Global or General Pathways Fellowship application.

**Sophomores** should definitely spend some time sorting out their post- SJC ideas. This is a great summer to get a job or a volunteer position that could add substance to your resume. These experiences could also point you toward Ariel internships after your junior year. If you think you might want to go to graduate school, this is a good summer to research particular schools and perhaps even visit to get a feel for specific locations.

**Juniors**, hopefully you already have internships, jobs or extra study lined up, but if not, this is a critical time to be thinking about what you plan to do after graduation. If you know you want to go to graduate school, even if you don't know when, study for and take the GRE ([www.ets.org](http://www.ets.org)) or some other grad school entrance exam this summer (Law School Entrance Exam-LSAT; [www.lsac.org](http://www.lsac.org).) The GRE scores are good for 5 years, so you could use them the year after you graduate from St. John's, but you also won't be trying to squeeze in that exam next fall when you are reading Einstein. Summer is the time to start applications for graduate schools and other post-graduate programs, e.g. Peace Corps, Mississippi Teachers Corps, Teach for America, State Department Internships... Leaving any or all of this to the fall of your senior year, you will soon realize that you simply don't have enough time to be both a good student and a stellar applicant. Plan ahead!

## Competitive Scholarship Applications to Start in the Summer

Many national and international scholarships require lengthy application documents and have deadlines in the early fall. You can find complete information about these various competitions in Agora or at the Career Services office, but here is a summary of scholarships for particular class years.

**Rising Sophomores and Juniors:** Don't forget Ariel Internships and Global and General Pathways Fellowships. Doing research and making connections this summer will make life easier when the Global Pathways application is due in December, 2016, when Ariel is due in mid-late February, 2017, and when General Pathways is due in early March 2017. If you might be interested in applying for a Goldwater Scholarship ([www.act.org/goldwater](http://www.act.org/goldwater)) which pays up to \$7,500 towards either junior or senior year, completing a summer research internship can make your Goldwater application much more convincing. If you are seriously thinking about graduate school in the humanities or social sciences, check out the Beinecke Scholarship ([www.beineckescholarship.org](http://www.beineckescholarship.org)). If you have been politically or socially active for several years, a Truman Scholarship may be perfect for you ([www.truman.gov](http://www.truman.gov)).

**Rising Seniors:** If you'd like to spend a year overseas after graduation, check out the Fulbright grants ([www.us.fulbright.org/home.html](http://www.us.fulbright.org/home.html)) or consider scholarships to study in the UK, such as Rhodes ([www.rhodesscholar.org](http://www.rhodesscholar.org)), Marshall ([www.marshallscholarship.org](http://www.marshallscholarship.org)), or Mitchell ([www.us-irelandalliance.org](http://www.us-irelandalliance.org)), click on "Scholarships). If you are thinking about a career in international

relations, look at the Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Graduate Fellowship (<http://woodrow.org/fellowships/pickering>) or the Rangel International Graduate Fellowship Program (<http://www.rangelprogram.org>).

There are many other scholarships, fellowships and grants so check with Career Services on details. Also, be mindful that **all these applications require a great deal of preparation including letters of recommendation**, so don't wait until the week before the deadline.
