Secretary: Beth Martin (A94)

Treasurer: Hannah Ard (A92)

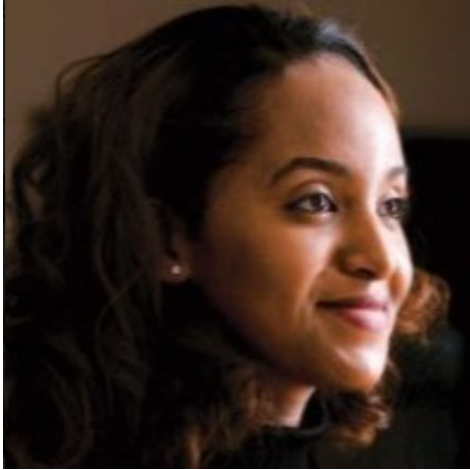


Hannah Ard (A92) is completing her first term as an At-Large Director, during which time she co-led the Alumni Giving Council and served as Project Manager, and is seeking to serve as Board Treasurer.

Hannah obtained her Master's Degree in Sociology from the University of Maryland, College Park, where she focused on gender, work, and family issues, and wrote her master's thesis on the impact of social capital on children's academic performance in school. Following that, Hannah attended Harvard Law School and graduated cum laude in 1997. She began her legal career in Washington, DC, and worked for the Office of General Counsel of the Department of Health and Human Services representing the Secretary in Medicare litigation, the Federal Trade Commission where she focused on consumer protection matters, and the Department of Justice where she litigated constitutional law cases for the Civil Division. Hannah moved to private practice in 2002 and worked at Wilmer Hale before taking time off to be at home with her young children. Hannah moved to the Seattle area in 2007. Hannah continued her legal practice in the Pacific Northwest, and is currently counsel to the firm at Ballard Spahr, LLP where she specializes in employment law, both advising clients on legal matters, and representing them in litigation.

Approximately 20 years ago while living in the DC area, Hannah served in an informal capacity with some other alumni, working with the then-Director of Annual Giving Maggie Griffin Fox and others, on increasing alumni giving to the College. She hosted several dinners for SJC seniors as they transitioned into the "real" world and informally mentored several of them for many years. She is excited about the prospect of continuing to engage with both the alumni community and the College itself.

At Large Director, Nani Detti (SF20)



Nani Detti (SF20) is completing her first term as an At-Large Director, co-leading the Career Services Working Group, and is seeking a second term.

After graduating from St. John's, she earned her Master of Arts in Law and Diplomacy from the Fletcher School at Tufts University. At Large Director, Ethan Carrier (A00)



Ethan Carrier (A00) graduated from St. John's College in Annapolis in 2000 and earned a Juris Doctorate from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 2005. Ethan is a career public servant who has become an expert in government ethics and public integrity law, having developed a passion for good government early in law school.

Ethan has worked as an attorney for the New York City Conflicts of Interest Board since 2012, and, for the last nine years, has served as its General Counsel. In this role, he acts as the chief legal counsel to the Board and supervises a team of attorneys and paralegals in providing legal guidance about the City's Conflicts of Interest Law to New York City's 300,000 public servants. This work has been both deeply rewarding and profoundly challenging, as it involves justly administering and enforcing a complicated law that operates at the intersection of the private lives and public duties of City employees and appointees from every walk of life, serving the public as police, pension managers, teachers, criminal prosecutors, and so on.

Prior to his work in New York City government, Ethan served as a federal government ethics attorney in Washington, D.C., at the U.S. Office of Government Ethics, the U.S. Department of the Treasury, the Federal Election Commission, and the Office of White House Counsel. Additionally, he has also been an active member of the New York City Bar Association, where he recently served as a member of the Committee on Government Ethics & State Affairs. Outside of his career, Ethan enjoys writing, photography, and tinkering on his old farmhouse in the Catskills. Originally from Wisconsin, and having grown up in southern California and Texas, Ethan currently resides in Manhattan with his wife and their two cats, when they are not escaping the City for quieter weekends in nature. Ethan adopted a plant-based diet and lifestyle 17 years ago out of concerns for the environment and animal welfare. Keeping close to St. John's, he has attended alumni seminars in Washington DC and New York City.

At Large Director, Nick Urban (SFGI11)



Nick Urban (SFGI11) is an entrepreneur, executive, and software engineer based in Santa Fe, New Mexico. He co-founded TalentWall, a software company, where he led engineering and operations for 6 years, growing to 20 employees, before its acquisition in 2022.

Alongside his career in technology, he has pursued a lifelong study of philosophy and the liberal arts, earning the MALA from St. John's College in Santa Fe and an MA in Religious Studies from the University of Chicago Divinity School. Nick has also served in nonprofit leadership roles, including as President of the Foundation for Enlightened Society, a public charity that supports Buddhist practice and study.

Raymond Gifford (A89) practices regulatory law, managing the Denver office of Wilkinson Barker Knauer LLP. His primary professional focus is advancing electric transmission builds in the Western U.S. Before immersing himself in the gripping world of monopoly regulation, Ray ran The Progress & Freedom Foundation, a think tank in Washington, DC, focused on studying the law and economics of the digital revolution.
