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2022 Information for Parents and Students: Annapolis

At this time, St. John's College intends to host Summer Academy on each of our campuses. We will continue to monitor and adhere to CDC and state guidelines as we actively work to develop policies and procedures that allow us to adapt our program in the era of Covid-19. The updated policies may include measures such as single occupancy dorm rooms, requiring face masks, social distancing, and a restructuring of field trips and enrichment activity options. If we are unable to operate as an in-person program, we will notify families as soon as possible and refund any deposits as necessary.

Arrival & Registration

Registration will be held on the campus quad from 3 to 5 p.m. on Sundays. Parking is available in the Campbell and Mellon parking lots or in the Calvert Street Garage, which can all be accessed from St. John's Street. A map of campus is also available for download on the Summer Academy website. **We ask that students arrive to campus between 12–3 p.m. on the day of Registration.** If they are not arriving to campus with a parent or guardian, **students are responsible for getting to campus on their own.** If students are flying in from out-of-town, we recommend flying into Baltimore/Washington International Airport (BWI) as it is most conveniently located in relation to campus. Ride share companies like Uber and Lyft are available or for more information on transportation from the airport to campus, please visit the BWI website. *If you expect your student to arrive to campus earlier than 12 p.m., please contact usso we can help coordinate their early arrival.*

Pick-Up & Departure

A Farewell Brunch will be held from 10:30 a.m. to noon in the Randall Dining Hall for Summer Academy students, their parents, and all Summer Academy staff and faculty. Don't forget to RSVP on the registration forms and include any allergies or dietary restrictions. Students must have all their things packed and be out of the dorms by noon. A departure shuttle will be available to take groups of students to the airport on Saturdays. If the student's flight time does not align with the shuttle schedule students may need to rely on Uber/Lyft or other ground transportation options.

Stayover Weekend Supervision

If your student stays on campus for a stayover weekend there is a \$100 fee. If your student is staying multiple weeks, an off-campus day trip will be planned by the Outdoor Program with St. John's College. They will provide weekend supervision and activities (i.e. hiking, swimming, bowling, or visiting a museum). Students will have time to do laundry upon their return and prepare for the next week; emergency services and public safety will be available but the camp nurse will not. Please see the self-administered medication form if your student takes prescribed medication. We recommend sending your student with spending money if they might need it but the \$100 fee will cover the activity and cost of meals. No students are allowed to stay over on the night of July 30.

Class Preparation

Students are expected to read all class materials before they arrive, and there will be some free time during the week to do second readings. Because classes are discussion-based, the success of a conversation requires that all students are well prepared and engaged. Students are not expected to purchase or otherwise acquire the reading materials on their own. Readings will be compiled into a single document and will be available for download soon. There is no need to print them; hard copies of all readings will be provided to students upon arrival.

Students who would like to request accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act will need to submit the Disabilities Registration Form to the assistant dean of St. John's College. Please email kidus.kebede@sjc.edu for further instructions.

The Dorm

Roommates will be assigned based on the Room Sharing Questionnaire filled out as a part of students' registration forms. Roommate and dorm room assignments will be given out at registration. Resident assistants will be available at registration to show students to their assigned dorm rooms and to help them get settled. Students will be housed on campus in the Pinkney, Chase-Stone, and Humphreys dorm buildings. Multiple resident assistants will live on each floor, and every student will be assigned to a group supervised by a resident assistant. When possible, males and females live in separate residence halls. Depending on the gender breakdown of the group, it may be necessary to have male and female students occupy the same dorm building. If this occurs, genders will be separated by floor. There are no co-ed bathrooms.

Dorm rooms provide the following furniture and accessories for each student: an extra-long, twin-sized bed with box-spring and mattress, mattress cover, pillow, set of sheets, one blanket, desk, chair, bookcase, desk lamp, trash can, mirror, dresser, closet, and venetian blinds. Each dorm building has a small common room with a refrigerator, comfortable chairs, and a community announcement bulletin board.

What to Bring

Dining

Meals are provided by Bon Appétit, the college's food service provider. Breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be provided daily Monday–Friday, with the exception of lunch during the field trip. The Sunday of arrival and Registration will include dinner for the students. Saturday morning includes a Farewell Brunch for students and their parents before pick-up. Bon Appétit provides a variety of cuisines, including vegetarian, vegan, and gluten-free options, and they are able to accommodate most dietary restrictions. If you require special dietary accommodations, please indicate this on the "Student Information" registration form through CampDoc.

Supervision and On-Campus Resources

College faculty will work with students in the classroom, and the college's professional staff will organize and lead out-of-classroom activities. Undergraduate resident assistants will provide safety and supervision to Summer Academy students. RAs are hand-picked from the student body to uphold the Code of Conduct and exemplify the virtues of St. John's College. Each are responsible for a group of six to eight Summer Academy students. An adult senior resident and two Summer Academy coordinators reside on campus and are on-call at all times. All Summer Academy staff members are CPR/AED certified and are trained in emergency procedures and conflict resolution. All professional support staff, including the Summer Academy directors, Health Center staff, the director of student services, and the athletic director, are available during regular office hours, and a counselor is on-call at all times.
