City of New York Parks & Recreation, Internships at Parks, New York, NY



The New York City Department of Parks & Recreation is a public agency of over 3,500 people that care for about 29,000 acres of parkland. The Parks' principal mission is to keep the parks, playgrounds, and sitting areas of New York City clean and safe, while also developing the City's recreational opportunities by offering quality facilities, programs, and events to meet the needs of all New Yorkers. Internships are available in many fields of interest.

Student Conservation Association (SCA), Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge, Biology Internship, Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge, Cambridge, MD
Program dates: May 23 – August 14, 2022

At this SCA internship you will learn, participate, and assist with the implementation of Hurricane Sandy Resiliency projects at Chesapeake Marshlands National Wildlife Refuge Complex. The duties include but are not limited to: vegetation and wildlife monitoring, data entry, report preparation, light maintenance, educating the public, and invasive species inventory and eradication (including the use of herbicides). The intern will be working long hours and some weekends as necessary. Field work is in marsh and forest communities, typically in hot, humid, conditions with numerous biting insects. Boat work is required. Interns must be in good physical condition, possess valid driver's license, and have good communication and organizational skills, ability to work well with others, live in close quarters, and be an enthusiastic field worker.

Open to: those with biology experience and who are U.S. citizens

Stipend: \$250/week with on-site provided housing and a one-time travel allowance of \$1,100. You will also be eligible for an AmeriCorps education award valued at \$1,538.

Student Conservation Association, Excelsior Conservation Corps (ECC), NY State 7-Month Residential Americorps Program
Program dates: May 22 – December 16, 2022



ECC works on environmental stewardship projects on DEC and OPRHP public lands that result in the protection of natural resources. These important initiatives help sustain New York's natural resources for the long-term benefit of residents and visitors. Based on the needs identified by partners, SCA Excelsior members serve NY State's public lands by carrying out responsibilities such as invasive species removal, timber stand improvement, trail construction and/or maintenance (including stonework, bog bridging, box step construction, and retaining wall construction), basic carpentry, and other chainsaw intensive projects.

Eligibility: Open to applicants between the ages of 18 and 26 (veterans up to age 28) who are U.S. citizens
Compensation: \$800 bi-weekly living allowance with housing provided. Food is provided while members are in the field. After 1,200 hours of service, members also receive an education award of \$4,546.50

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation seeks a Maryland Oyster Gardening Assistant Field based in Annapolis, Baltimore, Shady Side, MD, and Maryland's Eastern Shore.

CBF's Environmental Protection and Restoration department defends and restores the Chesapeake Bay by protecting the Bay's natural resources from pollution and other harmful activities by fighting for strong and effective laws and regulations; restoring the Bay's essential habitats and filtering mechanisms; and involving citizens in CBF's environmental efforts by recruiting, training, and incorporating them as effective partners and leaders.



The Maryland Oyster Gardening Assistant will help CBF (Chesapeake Bay Foundation) staff with the planning and execution of their Oyster Gardening Program. CBF's Oyster Gardening Program is a community-based program that teaches hundreds of people how to grow and care for oysters to use in restoration projects throughout Maryland. Most of the work will take place in Anne Arundel County but travel to other areas within the state such as Baltimore, the Eastern Shore and Southern Maryland is required. The internship will consist of both administrative aspects of the program, such as volunteer engagement and event planning, as well as field work to prepare materials for the oyster gardening program. The Oyster Gardening Assistant must be prepared to attend all oyster gardening events, which may include evenings and weekends.

Hands of Hope, Gap Year Opportunity for Graduating Seniors Casa de Esperanza de los Niños, Inc., Houston, TX



Hands of Hope is Casa de Esperanza's service year program which recruits recent college graduates and other highly qualified young adults, from throughout the United States to work with emotionally and medically fragile children. Hands of Hope is seeking passionate individuals who have a desire to help abused, neglected and HIV positive children through work with the agency. This program brings together approximately 35 young adults annually to live and work with some of society's most vulnerable children.

Interns have daily care of the children, household management, and the coordination of medical appointments and therapy sessions. The Hands of Hope Interns also work with caseworkers, psychological staff and community volunteers on a routine basis to ensure that the children in placement receive the highest quality of care. This experience gives you the opportunity to earn hands-on experience learning how abuse, neglect, and the effects of HIV play a role in some of society's most vulnerable children.

Eligibility: Open to those who are at least 21 years old; willing to make a one-year commitment; college degree preferred; strong personal qualities and valid U.S. driver's license

Compensation and Benefits: Housing, monthly stipend of \$600/month, health insurance, life insurance, two weeks paid vacation per year



The Boston College Developmental Psychology program is now accepting applications for their NSF Research Experience for Undergraduates summer internship. Summer interns will gain hands-on experience in all aspects of socio-cognitive developmental psychology research while also participating in professional development meetings and learning computer programming. This is an excellent program for students who want to learn more about research who may be interested in pursuing graduate school. This internship will take place **in-person** on Boston College's campus. There are four participating developmental psychology labs. Students will be accepted to primarily work within one of these labs for the duration of the summer. Students will indicate their lab preference in the application.

All research in the Gopnik Cognitive Development and Learning Lab is broadly focused on children's development of cause and effect reasoning and how they learn from and about other people. They are looking for dedicated and motivated undergraduate students interested in pursuing a graduate degree in developmental psychology or a related field.

Interns will work closely with a graduate student assisting them on all aspects of the research process. Interns will help with experimental and stimuli design; recruiting participants 3 - 14 years old and adults; and collecting, organizing, coding, and analyzing data. Interns will meet regularly with their mentors to discuss the theoretical motivations of the studies they are working on as well as the findings of other empirical papers both related to the studies in the lab and important to the field in general.

The Campbell Foundation launched its Chesapeake Fellowship Program in the Fall of 2018. The primary objectives of the Chesapeake Fellowship Program are to:

- Support the Foundation's ability to solve complex problems by welcoming diverse talents, perspectives, and experiences
- Develop Fellows to become future non-profit leaders by enhancing their capabilities and skills, building their professional network, and expanding their knowledge of conservation activities in the Chesapeake region

The Chesapeake Fellow, Civic Engagement will work closely with the Program Director, Civic Engagement, and other members of staff to advance the Foundation's Civic Engagement Program. Primary tasks range from exploring prospective grantee organizations to the review, analysis, and presentation of funding requests.
