









HOW DO I START MY ENROLLMENT?

We encourage students to begin the enrollment process online, as it's the fastest and easiest way to submit the required materials.

- > Go to your online application portal/status page at admissions.sjc.edu/status
- > Submit the reply form to accept your offer of admission.
- > Pay your non-refundable \$500 deposit online to secure your place in the Class of 2023. If you prefer to pay your deposit by phone using a credit card, call the admissions office between 9 am-5 pm MT. If paying by check, please make your check payable to St. John's College and mail directly to the campus.
- > If you applied for financial aid, sign and return your financial aid agreement.

That is why we announced in 2018 that the college is raising \$300 million toward financial aid, enabling St. John's to reduce tuition for the first time in its history. The students we admit to the college are receiving about \$24,000 from alumni in order to reduce tuition to \$35,000. Many pay less with financial aid. Don't take our word for it. HOW DO I APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID?

We encourage all students to be actively involved in the financial aid process and understand how these decisions will affect them during and after college. We also understand that parents sometimes have additional questions and concerns in assisting students to make their education a reality. We are here to help! Need-based financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis. It is in your family's best interest to file the financial aid application as early as possible. If applying for financial aid, please follow the steps outlined below.

Step 1: U.S. citizens and permanent residents: File the FAFSA at fafsa.gov as soon as possible to qualify for the 2019-20 school year. The federal code for St. John's College in Santa Fe is 002093.

If this is your first time completing the FAFSA, both students and parent will need to apply for an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov. This will serve as your electronic signature.

International Students: Visit collegeboard.org and complete the CSS PROFILE as soon as possible.

Students will be asked to create a username and password. Make sure to save them, because they will be needed to reapply for financial aid each year. Once signed in, the site will guide you through the appropriate steps to complete the PROFILE.

Step 2: Once the Financial Aid Office has received the FAFSA or CSS PROFILE, you will be notified. Examples of additional information we may need are copies of parents' and students' Federal Tax transcripts, W-2 forms, or verification of siblings' college enrollment.

HOW DO I KNOW IF ST. JOHN'S IS THE RIGHT COLLEGE FOR ME?

Visiting campus is the best way to determine whether St. John's is the right fit for you. Register for any of the visit opportunities at **sjc.edu/visit**

Day Visit: Take a tour, talk to current students, and meet with an admissions counselor. You can also sit in on a class, eat in the dining hall, and meet with a faculty member. Be sure to allow some time to explore Santa Fe.

Overnight Visit: In addition to the activities of the day visit, you spend the night in a residence hall and observe more classes, including seminar. The overnight provides an insider's view of life at St. John's College.

If visiting is a hardship, ask us about our Apply & Fly program, which provides financial assistance for travel expenses.
