

Graduate Institute Educator Grant Application

The Graduate Institute was founded in 1967 as a summer program primarily for high school teachers. While the size and scope of the Institute has expanded, we seek to preserve a commitment to the education of those who dedicate their time in the service of education. As part of this commitment, St. John's College offers special financial aid for students who work in the field of education. This includes teachers, administrators, professors, curriculum developers, librarians, and other educational professionals. The Educator's Grant provides a one-third tuition grant to pursue either of the graduate programs without demonstrating need. Students who demonstrate financial need may qualify for up to the maximum of one-half the tuition for either program.

Applicants who wish to be considered for the Educator Grant must complete this form and attach a letter from the supervisor of their institution verifying their full-time employment.

Note: Applicants that meet the qualifications for this grant are not required to complete the normal application process for financial aid. However, applicants must complete the FAFSA in order to be considered for greater financial aid assistance beyond the one-third tuition grant, this includes the up to the maximum of one-half of tuition as mentioned above.
