Title IX/Sexual Misconduct: The Investigation Process





File A Report

The investigation process begins after a complaint is filed.

Review Report

Investigators will be appointed to the case. Both the Complainant and Respondent will be contacted individually to discuss next steps and resources available.

Interviews

The investigators will meet separately with the Complainant, Respondent, and witnesses to collect statements.

Summary of Evidence

Investigators write a final Summary of Evidence document and share it with the parties and the Sexual Misconduct/Title IX Coordinator.

Collection of Data

Evidence will be collected and analyzed, including but not limited to statements, medical documents, social media, and police reports (if available).

Supportive Measures

Before or during the investigation, supportive measures may be put in place, including but not limited to no contact directives.





Notification of Next Steps

The parties involved will be notified of the next steps. Possible steps include Post Investigation Dismissal, Non-Hearing Resolution, or referral to a Hearing Panel.

Support

The Sexual Misconduct/Title IX Coodinator is available for support, questions, and resources for all parties involved during and after the investigation.
