

A Brief History of the Alumni Association

1827: Alumni Association founded (Francis Scott Key was one of the founders)

1934: Alumni Association (AA) incorporated as an independent, non-profit organization supporting alumni and the College

1937: Introduction of the New Program, which splits alumni into Old and New Program segments

1951: SJC President Richard Weigle increases fundraising pressure on alumni

1967: Founding of the Graduate Institute

1980: SJC President Edward Delattre inaugurated. Expansion of Chapters network beyond the East Coast. Decision to limit fundraising efforts to alumni. By-Laws rewritten, SF alumni formally recognized as part of the AA

2010: By-Laws updated

- Board Restructure:
 - AAB president position divided into 3 consecutive 2-year positions: presidentelect, president, and past-president
 - Decreased board size from 30+ members to current size (max 20)
 - Chapter leads no longer de facto board members
 - o Incorporated separate fundraising group Philanthropia into the AA
 - Established the following Working Groups: Alumni Giving Council (formerly Philanthropia), Chapters, Career Services, Strategic Communications, Events, Student and Recent Alumni, & the Alumni Leadership Form (ALF), which brought ~100 alumni together (alternating campus yearly) to learn about AA initiatives and foster volunteerism
 - Cessation of AA member dues; funding of association now provided by the College

2017: ALF reimagined as a series of AA-organized events throughout the year at different locations & eventually online, in collaboration with SJC and alumni Chapters

2019: A philanthropy-based, financial model adopted by the college to make SJC accessible to more students; closer partnership between SJC and the AA to support the new model

2027: 200th Anniversary of the Alumni Association

Vision: A fully engaged alumni community that supports the College and contributes to the intellectual, professional, and personal development of its members.

Mission: To support alumni and the college by fostering fellowship and mutually beneficial connections among alumni, current students, faculty, and other members of the college community.

Alumni Giving Council: Sam Collins and Hannah Stires Ard, co-leads

The Alumni Giving Council (AGC) cultivates a culture of philanthropy among alumni by encouraging financial support for the Fund for St. John's College.

In 2022, the college reduced tuition by 33% (from \$52K to \$35K/year), and since then, the SJC community has joined together to increase philanthropy to help underwrite tuition costs. Together, we have invested in the longevity of the Program by making a St. John's education more affordable and more accessible to a wider-range of students than ever before.

- Since 2022, tuition at St. John's has risen less than the rate of inflation and was almost 25 percent lower last year than a decade ago
- In 2023 the St. John's Endowment generated the equivalent of \$11,000 in annual support for every student.
- 2025 marks the fourth consecutive fiscal year in which gifts, grants, and the income from the St. John's Endowment played a greater role in sustaining the college than tuition.
- Starting this fall, SJC covers tuition for families earning \$75K/year or less

Alumni Giving Council

In 2024-25, the AGC helped the college exceed goals on two major fundraising activities and supported additional fundraising opportunities to bolster the Annual Fund for St. John's College.

FY25: 398 first-time donors to the College, 149 (40%) from AGC-supported activities



Career Services Working Group Nani Detti and Joseph Larson, co-leads

The Odyssey Program originated during the pandemic as the "Jobs for Johnnies" BVG initiative. It has evolved into a mentorship program that provides opportunities for students to learn about potential careers and gain valuable interview and networking skills. The Office of Career Services in Annapolis and the Office of Personal and Professional Development in Santa Fe identify advisees on their respective campuses, while the AAB's Career Services Working Group recruits alumni advisors who met with these students over several months.

2024-25 Mentorship Model included sophomores, juniors, seniors, and GI students. Alumni advisors worked in teams, meeting with groups of students in 8 professional pathways:

- o Business, Entrepreneurship & Leadership
- o International Relations, Public Policy & Service
- Law & Government
- Philosophy, Academics & Education
- Psychology & The Mind
- Public Health & Medicine
- STEM, Data Science and Sustainability
- Writing, Arts & Media
- Total number of students supported: 81
- Total number of alumni advisors: 35

Career Services Working Group

What's ahead:

Due to the high amount of coordination and limited staff bandwidth, the Career Services Working group is collaborating with the Office of Career Services in Annapolis and the Office of Personal and Professional Development in Santa Fe to create more targeted opportunities in the above pathways for students in 2025-26, including:

- Virtual Networking Panel
- 1:1 Mentorship opportunities
- In-Person Networking Event in Both SF and AN

- Monitoring AA email (sjcaa@sjc.edu) with 24-hour response for general alumni queries, chapters questions, nominations suggestions, etc.

Events Working Group

The Student & Recent Alumni Working Group (SARA) provides support to undergraduate and graduate students as they begin their time at St. John's and also as they transition to their post-college experience. Our student representives play a vital part in informing SARA:

- Launched student support over breaks:
 - Winter break: Provided rides to town, food, and a dinner in SF
 - Spring Break: Provided dinners for students on both campuses
 - After learning about the AAB's work, The William H. and Mattie Wattis Harris Foundation made a \$5K gift to the Santa Fe campus's Emergency Fund to further support students
- Provided diploma tubes to graduating students in May for Santa Fe students

From the Alumni Association By-Laws:

ARTICLE IX COMMITTEES: SECTION 1. NOMINATING

COMMITTEE. The Nominating Committee shall consist of the President-Elect, who shall act as chair, the President, the Past President, the Director of Alumni Relations, and five appointed members of the Association in good standing, who may not be current members of the Board. The five appointed members of the Association shall be appointed annually by the President-Elect. The duties of the Nominating Committee shall include submitting nominations to the Board for officers of the Association, At-Large Directors, Alumni-elected BVG members, Directors Emeriti, and such other positions and honors as the Board shall direct. No member of the Nominating Committee shall be eligible for nomination or election to any position nominated by the Nominating Committee.

Governance Committee Beth Martin, lead

- Led by Beth Martin (A94), the 2024-25 Governance Committee members were Lee Katherine Goldstein SF90; Sabina Sulat A92; Su Bradford SF89.
- The Committee ensures changes are aligned with the Alumni Association's Bylaws and Code of Operating Resolutions (COR)
- Major Initiatives this year: Review the By-Laws and propose the amendments. The two most important are to:
 - Remove the requirement of mailed elections notifications. This was a time-consuming, wasteful, and ultimately unnecessary requirement that is filled by digital communications.
 - Alignment of the Alumni Association By-Laws with The SJC Polity, specifically in reducing the number of alumni-elected BVG Trustees from three to two and changing their election cycle accordingly.

Introduction

As is customary, the SJC Alumni Association Board creates and implements a Strategic Plan to guide its work on behalf of the Alumni Association. The following plan is informed by conversations the three Alumni Association Presidents and Project Manager conducted with AAB Working Groups and Directors Emeriti in May 2024, as well as feedback from past AA Presidents, the College-wide President, and the SJC Senior Director of Alumni & Constituent Engagement.

This current Strategic Plan is effective October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2026, though as a living document, programs may be tweaked based on data and input from our stakeholders (i.e., AAB directors, our partners at St. John's College, the Alumni Association, students, and faculty).

The plan's main objective is to build on the successes of the previous strategic plan by identifying five major, interconnected initiative areas, deepening current programs and introducing new ones within them, and eliminating projects that were not effective or did not deliver an appropriate return on time and monetary investment.

A more connected model: 5 Initiatives

Alumni Support OBJECTIVE: Support alumni at all stages of their post-SJC lives, including immediately upon graduation to ensure they become engaged members of the AA.

Student Support OBJECTIVE: Support students of the undergraduate and GI programs before they transition out of SJC and after graduation.


Community Support OBJECTIVE: Support the wider SJC community, including faculty and staff. Where appropriate, support closer ties between the college and their towns.

Fundraising Support OBJECTIVE: Successful fundraising in support of the college's philanthropy-centered financial model.

Governance & Systems OBJECTIVE: Improve AA governance, procedures, & systems for efficiency among the working groups, seamless member transition, & stronger comms with the AA.

A more connected model: Working Groups
